

The 2017 Honky Tonk Male Vocalist of the Year won the crowd over and lived up to his well-earned reputation of performing in the traditional style of the legendary stars like Ernest Tubb, Tex Ritter and the great Hank Williams. But in the end, the real stars of the show are all of you, Brethren, who made this event a huge success due to your generosity and support. The success of this fundraiser goes to show that the Austin Scottish Rite Valley is indeed one of the brightest stars in Texas Masonry.

### Scottish Rite 101

Scottish Rite 101 is a program for Blue Lodges that explains the basics of Scottish Rite Masonry in an approximately 10 minute Masonic Moment format to be given at a Stated Meeting of a constituent Lodge. It will be given by an Ambassador or by invitation to a particular, well versed Scottish Rite Mason. The Brother giving the talk will then stay after the meeting for a few minutes to answer any questions that the Blue Lodge Mason may have about Scottish Rite Masonry.

Scottish Rite 101 is currently an ongoing project after stated meetings of Austin Lodge #12. It is held in the Scottish Rite Theater at about 9 pm on the third Monday of each Month. All are welcome.



The purpose of the program is to elicit more interest in Scottish Rite Masonry and to bring Blue Lodge Masons the possibility of more light in their lives. We believe that Scottish Rite Masonry is uniquely positioned to help seeking Masons to study, thereby promoting deeper thinking and more and better involvement in both their Blue Lodge as well as at the Austin Valley.
